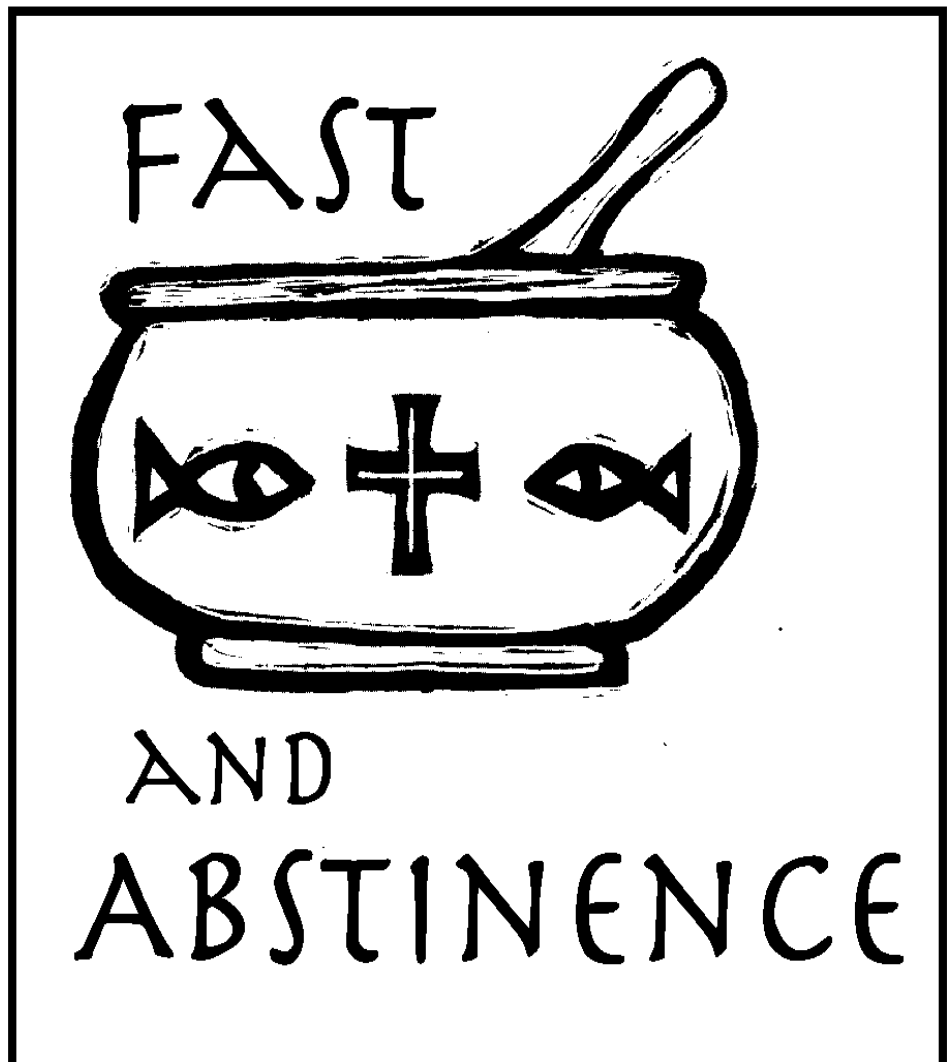


MISSION STATEMENT

From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parishioners,

This is the last Sunday before we go into the holy season of Lent. The scripture readings of today prepare us to trust in God and not waver. Even if a mother were to forget the baby in her womb, I will not forget you, says the Lord (I Reading). So trust Him.

The gospel helps us to focus on God and not on any other worldly pleasures. First seek the Kingdom of God and its righteousness and everything else will be given you besides.

Human life is riddled with pain. Much of it is real and results from tragic events and difficult choices. But often we experience psychic pain that results from focusing on the past or future rather than on the present. We mourn "what might have been" as if regret could change the past, or we obsess over what might be as if worry could alter the future. Jesus often urges "be not afraid" because he knows that fear turns tomorrow into a worrisome monster that fogs our vision.

Jesus teaches us to trust and help us see the big picture of life. He tells us to stop focusing on anxiety and learn from the birds of the air and lilies of the field. But first he gives a solemn warning: do not worry about your life because concern for 'mammon' prevents us from serving 'God'. His conviction is that tragic consequences follow efforts "to serve two masters".

Jesus calls for more trust than most can muster, but the alternative is a life of fruitless worry, so his tone is ever more insistent as he uses the analogies of birds and flowers. "You of little faith" is more lament than indictment, but Jesus shows little patience for anxiety that replaces trust in God. Love God and seek the Kingdom, then you will have what truly matters. Though cognizant of human struggle and pain, Jesus' last line is not without humor – can one toss away worry with anything but a smile?

Lenten Season. The Holy Season of Lent begins with the celebration of Ash Wednesday of March 5th. Even though it is not a holy day of obligation,

all the faithful are strongly exhorted to attend mass and receive ashes as a penitential mark of our entry into this holy season. St. Bernardine will offer mass and ashes at 6.30 a.m. and 12 noon.

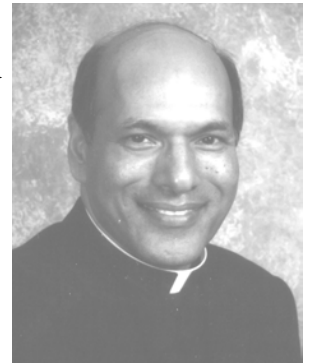
The annual observance of Lent is a special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Through its two fold theme of repentance and baptism, the season of Lent disposes both the catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery. Catechumens are led to the sacrament of initiation by means of the rite of election, scrutinies and catechesis. The faithful, listening more intently to the word of God and devoting themselves to prayer, are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew their baptismal promises. Since Lent is primarily a penitential season, it is strongly recommended that the individual Christian and the whole Christian community conduct a penitential celebration. In our church it will be during the Parish Mission on April 6, 7 and 8. So please save the dates to participate in the mission and celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation, so that all may be helped to prepare to celebrate more fully the paschal mystery.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence. See the guidelines elsewhere in the bulletin. Fridays of Lent are to be observed with abstinence from meat and meat products. Please participate in the mass and Stations of the Cross at 7 p.m. on Fridays. We offer Soup for Souls on March 18, 25 and April 1. Besides a variety of delicious soups, there will be a spiritual talk to stimulate us. Please read, understand and follow the Lenten and Holy Week Schedule in the bulletin.

May you have a holy season of Lent.

Musical Notes

Just over 50 years ago, the 2nd Vatican Council published the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. Article 14 stated that “*full and active participation by all the people is the aim to be considered before all else*”. The 6th Chapter, Sacred Music, stated that the musical tradition of the church “*is a treasure of inestimable value*” and that “*the people’s own religious songs are to be encouraged*”.

Nine years later, in 1972, the United States Bishops’ Committee on the Liturgy issued Music in Catholic Worship. This document gave specific guidelines, stating that “*Music serves the expression of faith.*”. It further explained three judgments must be satisfied when choosing music for liturgy. First, was the music technically good?

This refers to the parameters of music: rhythm, meter, timbre, melody and harmony. We were cautioned against using the type of music that was typical of popular songs. Next was the liturgical judgment. In other words, at what points during the liturgy is music appropriate? Which music should be sung by cantor or choir alone, and which music should be sung by entire assembly? Finally, is the particular music or musical setting pastoral? In other words, does it enable people to express their faith in the specific place and culture.

In 1982 the United States Bishops’ Committee on the Liturgy offered further guidelines. One of the most striking statements in this document concerned the use of recorded music. Recorded music “*should, as a general norm, never be used within the liturgy to replace the congregation, the choir, the organist, or other instrumentalists.*”

In 2008, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops published Sing to the Lord: *Music in Divine Worship*. This document begins with an explanation, “*Why We Sing*”.

“*God has bestowed upon his people the gift of song. God dwells within each human person, in the place where music takes its source. Indeed, God, the giver of song, is present whenever his people sing his praises.*”

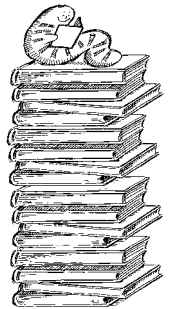

Regulations for Lent

All Catholics over 14 years of age are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays in Lent. For people 18 to 59, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also fast days. This means that a person should have only one complete meal on these days, with two much smaller meals to help get through the day. These two smaller meals should not together, equal the one full meal.

OPERATION RICE BOWL

Operation Rice Bowl, Catholic Relief Services annual Lenten program, offers Catholics here in the U.S. an opportunity to follow that call to sacrifice by learning about their brothers and sisters living in poverty, and to make sacrificial contributions that will help them improve their lives.

Each Lent, Catholic families, parishes and schools symbolic rice bowls during the 40 days of Lent as the focal point for their prayer, fasting, and learning. Participants fast in solidarity with those who hunger and make the small sacrifice of preparing simple, meatless recipes from developing countries each week, putting the money they would have spent on a big meal into the rice bowls. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Christians have always imagined initiation as a journey. Saul was on a journey on the Damascus road when he was knocked off his feet by an encounter with the Risen Lord. After stumbling, blind, to a Christian household, he emerged days later, baptized and clear sighted, as Paul. Enlightened, he begins a life so disconnected with his former ways that it seems to require a new name.

The custom of acquiring a new name at baptism is thus very old, and is a deeper question than “naming the baby”; it is, rather, one of a break with the past and a place in the community. The first Christians mostly kept their pagan names, and therefore blended in with their neighbors. Eventually, some people began to name their children after Christian virtues or feasts, like “Ephiphanus” for a child born on Epiphany, or “Fides” for faith. Later, the names of beloved martyrs or saints began to take hold, as older converts exchanged their birth names for the names of admired saints. Today, catechumens may still choose to assume a “Christian name” before baptism, and parents are still asked to be mindful of our tradition as they give a name to a child.
