From the Pastor's Desk



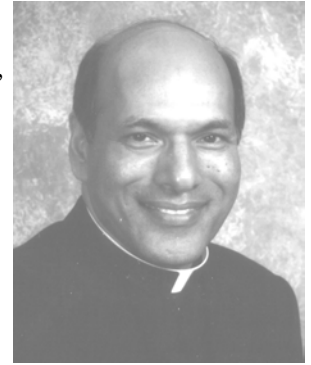
My dear parishioners,
Today's gospel reading known as the Disciples of Emmaus is said to be the first influence in the writing of the Gospel because it is in the opening of the scriptures and the breaking of the bread that the disciples recognize Jesus as living and from that moment on it is a looking back into the life of Jesus all the way into his infancy. So the Gospel owes its making to this incident of Emmaus and as such it has utmost importance in our study and meditation of the gospels.

Sometimes new worlds unexpectedly slip up over our horizon and catch us off guard. One morning we get up, stand at the foot of our bed, look out the window, and so briefly think how good it is to be alive; and for a moment we smile to ourselves before resuming the duties of our day. Or we sit with a friend at a noonday lunch, telling stories and laughing over what our lives have been; and somewhere in the midst of it all we think to ourselves that what is happening right at this moment is worth all the struggles and tears of life. Or we sit by ourselves in the rare quiet of a house that is hardly ever so, and day-dream, and think about what has gone on in this house over all the days and years, and realize that more than living has happened here, that love has, and maturing; and then the back door slams and our day returns to its tumultuous chaos.

These are all moments of grace, moments when the shadows part if only briefly, and we see more clearly than we ever have before, that it's the very presence of God in which we live and move. Then of course the moment disappears and we would like to tell someone about it and may be we try, but in the end our words fall short. After all, how does one find words to explain how for a brief while we walked life with God more consciously than ever before?

I find myself wondering if that was part of what took place in the gospel of today as Cleopas and his friend found themselves joined by a stranger on their journey from Jerusalem to Emmaus. How could they not know this stranger was Jesus? May be the grace of it was that through faith they came to recognize the Lord Jesus among them, and it didn't much matter whether that drawing of light came

quickly or slowly. What did matter was that it happened. As many have said, life is a journey. Faith too. And journeys take us to all sorts of unexpected places, or else they are not real journeys. Faith can be one of those unexpected turns in the road that make the journey new.



So as we listen to the gospel narrative of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus when Jesus appeared to them and interpreted the scriptures and broke bread with them when they recognized him, it is our turn to recognize Him in the Holy Eucharist when word and bread are broken. Let our eyes of faith see the risen Lord in our midst watching and guarding us in our life's journey. Confirmation. Last Tuesday Bishop Francis Kane, the Vicar General of the Archdiocese, the second in command after the Cardinal, was here doing the Confirmation Liturgy when he confirmed 12 young men and women of our parish. It was a nice celebration with the families and friends of these young people. Bishop gave a very good and inspiring homily and invited these young people to be involved in the church activities, contributing their time and talents for the good of the community. Of course, the bishop had pictures with those confirmed in faith. First Holy Communion. This Sunday at the 10.30 mass 10 children of our parish will receive their First Holy Communion. Please pray for them. Mothers' Day. Next Sunday is Mothers' Day. At the end of all the masses, there will be a special blessing for all the mothers. They will come up to the sanctuary and receive a rose and the blessing. There will be a second collection next Sunday for the Catholic Charities of Chicago Archdiocese which run a number of programs for women and children. Please be generous. Marian Month. Month of May as you know is the Marian Month for Catholics when we show our special devotion to our Blessed Mother by praying the holy rosary everyday at home without fail. Dear mothers, please teach your children how to pray the rosary. There will be rosary said after morning mass daily in the chapel. May Our Blessed Mother keep you safe.

Musical Notes

“Without music the themes of hope and resurrection are very difficult to express”. The Bishops’ Committee on the Liturgy of the United States Catholic Conference made that statement in 1972, in the document *“Music in Catholic Worship”*. In that context, the Bishops were referring specifically to music funerals. But it would be wise to also consider that statement in the context of the Easter Season. In this context though, we must also consider what the document said about the entrance song. *“During the most important seasons of the Church year - Easter, Lent, Christmas, and Advent - it is preferable that most songs used at the entrance be seasonal in nature”.*

At St. Bernardine we have a good number of hymns to choose from. The Easter section of *GATHER Comprehensive* has 37 hymns that celebrate the resurrection of Christ, and 4 additional hymns for the Feast of the Ascension. The Easter section of *Word & Song* contains 22 (many of which are also in *GATHER*). Yet another hymn, based on the gospel story of Doubting Thomas, is found in a different section of *GATHER*. Over the course of the six Sundays of the Easter Season we will sing at least 11 of the hymns in *GATHER*, and 3 from *Word & Song*. In the past the choir has sung at least 3 of the other hymns in *GATHER*.

Returning to the subject of funerals, the hymns that are requested usually do focus on hope, or trust in God. How much more significant it might be, if, as the Bishops suggested, we focused on the theme of resurrection.
