From the Pastor's Desk



HAPPY MOTHERS' DAY

My dear parishioners,
Today is Good Shepherd Sunday, and the gospel refers to Jesus as the Good Shepherd. The uniqueness of the Good Shepherd is that the sheep recognize his voice and follow him and not the voice of a stranger. The shepherd's greatest strength according to the gospel, is not his muscle, intelligence or the professionalism in shepherding, but rather his voice. This is not a surprise because, in a

very real sense, our voice is who we are. Our voice reveals our interior self and the relationships that form us and give us an identity. How adept we are at forming an impression of a person we have never seen based only on the sound of his or her voice. The voice possesses the profound power to bind us interiorly with others. In the time of crisis we become deeply consoled merely by hearing the voice of one we love.

A small story will illustrate it. A young man was trying to get a job in a circus company. The manager decided to give him a chance to be assistant lion tamer and took him to the lion's cage. The head lion tamer was a beautiful young lady who was about to rehearse her act. She stepped into the cage and spoke a command to the lion. Obediently the lion crept towards her and then rolled over twice before it sat on its hind legs to beg for a treat. "Well" the manager said to the young man, "do you think that you can do that?" "I'm sure I could," he replied, "but first you will have to get the lion out of there." (From Reader's Digest, *Laughter, the Best Medicine*)

Just as the lion recognized the voice of its trainer, Jesus says the sheep recognize the voice of their shepherd. The centrality of Christ's voice in the relationship of the sheep with the Good Shepherd first appears in the gospel of John, in John the Baptist's description of his own relationship with Jesus. Again, Jesus promises that those who are faithful to hearing and heeding the voice of God's Son will hear it again after their death and that it will raise them up to new life. However, the efficacy of the voice of Jesus Christ eludes anyone who refuses to be committed to the truth it conveys. The voice of the Father that we hear in the Gospel of John resounds for our sake in order to deepen our belief in and our obedience to the One he has sent.

The Good Shepherd uses his voice to do three things. First of all, his voice calls us by name and leads us out into the fertile pastures. At climatic moments in the gospel of John, we hear Jesus calling those close to him by name: Peter, who receives his name from Jesus; Lazarus, as Jesus calls him from the tomb; and Mary Magdalene, at the tomb, to pacify her panic over the missing

body of Jesus. Christ uses his voice unceasingly to call us by name in order to assure us that we belong to him. As he calls us by name, we find our strength in his name.

Second, the thief and the robber differ from the Good Shepherd precisely in their attempt not to use their voice. Their objective 'to steal, slaughter and to destroy' is predicated on maintaining a perfect silence whereby they can sneak upon the unsuspecting sheep, climb over the gate and enact their evil. They know that the sheep, failing to recognize their unfamiliar voices, will only run away in fear. The voice of Jesus keeps us from their treachery by enabling us to follow only the Good Shepherd. We continue to follow the Good Shepherd's voice through Peter, the Supreme Shepherd of the church.

Third, the voice of the Good Shepherd gives us life in abundance. For the life that Jesus proffers is eternal life that flows from faith. If we desire superabundant life, then we must possess unshakable faith. And that faith comes to us by responding to the voice of Jesus as it remains perpetually active in the written words of the Gospel.

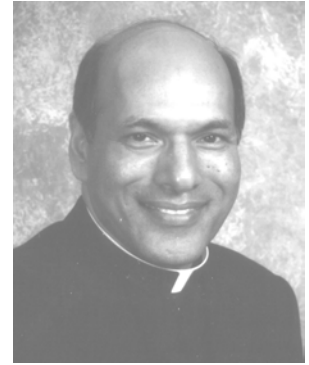

Musical Notes

The oldest of the Easter hymns that we sang this weekend is hymn #460, *Be Joyful, Mary*. The text appeared in 1695, published in *Symphonia Sirenum*, in Cologne, Germany. Part of the text is from the 14th Century Latin hymn, *Regina Coeli*. The tune, *REGINA COELI*, was published in a German hymnal, Liesentritt's *Gesangbuch*, in 1584.

Hymn #439, *Christ the Lord Is Risen Today*, was written in 1739, by Charles Wesley (1707-1788). The original title was *Hymn for Easterday*. This hymn, which originally had eleven stanzas, is sung to a Welsh tune, *LLANFAIR*, composed by Robert Williams, (1781-1821). The AABA form is typical of the Welsh hymn tunes of the 19th Century. This tune is also sung with another of Wesley's texts, #468, *Hail the Day That Sees Him Rise*, a hymn for the Feast of the Ascension. Four more of Wesley's are found in *GATHER*. He also wrote the fourth stanza of hymn # 457, *Jesus Christ Is Risen Today*.

Hymn #442, *Sing With All the Saints in Glory*, was written by William J. Irons (1812-1883). His collection *Psalms and Hymns for the Church* was published in London, in 1875. The original title was "Now is Christ Risen from the Dead, 1 Cor 15:20. It is sung with the tune *HYMN TO JOY*, arranged from the last movement of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony.

At the 10:30 AM Mass the choir sang a setting of the *Ave Maria*, composed by Jacob Arcadelt (? 1505-1568). This setting was included in the pre-Vatican II *St. Gregory Hymnal and Catholic Choir Book*.

The Victory Belongs to God Alone

April 30, 2014, was a monumental day. After nearly 28 years, the largest lawsuit ever filed by the abortion industry against the pro-life movement came to a close.

The plaintiff was the National Organization for Women, who also added as plaintiffs **all women in America who were actual or potential customers of abortion clinics**. N.O.W. sued pro-life activists Joe Scheidler, Tim Murphy, and Andy Scholberg, and the ProLife Action League by name, **and further requested relief from about one million pro-lifers**—one of whom might be sitting next to you in the pew!

What was the alleged crime? According to the plaintiffs, "conspiring in restraint of interstate commerce." In other words, plainly and boldly stated, pro-lifers threatened the huge profits of the unregulated abortion industry. The lawsuit then exploded into a national landmark antitrust and RICO (Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organization) case.

And the nearly three-decade long legal battle included an unprecedented *three trips before the U.S. Supreme Court*.

N.O.W. v. Scheidler brought about the birth of the Thomas More Society in March, 1997, just a few months after Tom Brejcha, partner in a Chicago law firm, was told by his managing partner that he would either have to "quit the case or quit the firm." Tom quit the firm. And some sixteen years later, he won the final legal battle as the 7th Circuit Court ordered N.O.W. to pay the defending law firm a modest \$63,391.45 (amounting to \$2,300 per year of litigation) for costs they had incurred.

"Preposterous" is what the Justices called the specious arguments of the abortion industry. "This litigation has lasted far too long. At last it is over," they wrote in their final comments.

How important is the Scheidler case? Without this hard-won victory, 40 Days for Life, all sidewalk counseling and prayer outreach campaigns could have been shut down, and thousands of innocent lives lost to abortion.

Thank God for the Thomas More Society! These brave and talented professionals could make much more money in conventional law firms, but they choose to trust in God and *fight the good fight*. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Every rectory office has received a panicked phone call from a person who has been invited to serve as a godparent, or from someone newly engaged, who suddenly “needs to get confirmed.” While the lack of confirmation is not an obstacle for marriage, it is for godparenting. Many are surprised that the Church seems to be looking for a kind of sacramental “seal” on one’s baptism before the door opens fully to this ministry. Yet if you think about it, would you want someone to guide you to a place that he or she had not yet been? A godparent has to be someone who has “been there” and knows the way.

Although signet rings and wax seals have passed from use, our society depends on “seals of approval” ranging from certificates of quality to the familiar safety seals on medicines and foods. While Eucharist is the “seal” of the sacrament of baptism, there is a sense in which one’s Christian initiation is also incomplete without confirmation. Have you been confirmed? Perhaps it’s time to inquire now, before you have to make that dreaded phone call!

FOLLOWING THE GOOD SHEPHERD

The joyful tone of the past three Sundays of Easter is a little darker today. All three readings remind us of suffering, death, and sin. We, like Peter’s audience in the first reading, can ask, “What are we to do?” And the answer will be the same: we must reform. Or, as Peter says in his first Letter, we have strayed like sheep and must return to the shepherd.

Jesus describes himself as a shepherd in today’s Gospel, and we know it was one of the earliest images of Christ in the apostolic church. Today’s passage continues the darker theme of the first two readings. Danger lurks and the sheep need protection. They might follow a false leader; they might be stolen or destroyed. Only in Jesus Christ will we be safe. Only in him will we have eternal life.
